INTERNET TERMS

- „**Client**“ – RW - businesses have clients.
CW - servers have clients.
- „**Cookie**“ – RW – a sweet biscuit.
CW - A cookie is a small amount of data generated by a website.
- „**Mirror**“ – RW - A mirror is something that you can see your reflection in.
CW - is a Web or FTP server that has the same files on it as another server.

- „**Spider**“ – RW – kind of arachnids
CW - software program that travels the Web, locating and indexing websites for search engines.
 - „**Dial-up**“ – refers to an Internet connection that is established using a modem. The modem connects the computer to standard phone lines, which serve as the data transfer medium.
 - *Applet, Certificate, Internet, Packet, Website, Webmaster...*

HARDWARE TERMS

- **„Bridge“** – RW - a structure that is built over a river...
CW - connects two or more local area networks (LANs) together.
 - **„Bus“** – RW – large vehicle (means of transport)
CW – another kind of connection – data goes up and down
 - **„Host“** – RW – someone who has guests
CW - computer that acts as a server for other computers on a network.

- „**jumper**“ – RW – piece of clothing (sweater)
CW - a small metal connector that acts as an on/off switch
 - „**switch**“ – RW - a small device, pushed up or down with your finger, controls and turns on or off an electric current
CW - is used to network multiple computers together.
 - *Volume, Workstation, Speakers, Keyboard, Disk, Drive, chip, boot....*

SOFTWARE TERMS

- „**bug**“ – RW – insect

CW - is an error in a software programm

- „**cron**“ – RW – old and ugly woman (crone)

CW - is a process or task that runs periodically on a Unix system.

(Syncing time, date etc.)

- „**daemon**“ – RW – evil spirit (demon)

CW - constantly running program that triggers actions when it receives certain input. (eg. Printing)

□ „**path**“ – RW - a route or track between one place and another

CW - defines the location of a file or folder in a computer's file system.

□ *Access, backup, cut, function, frozen, root...*

TECHNICAL TERMS

□ „**Apple**“ – RW – fruit

CW - company that makes Macintosh PC

□ „**burn**“ – RW – to be damaged by fire

CW - "burn a disc," you write data on it.

□ „**crop**“ – RW - a plant such as a grain, fruit or vegetable grown in large amounts

CW – eg. Crop image = you remove part of the image.

- „**leaf**“ - RW – green parts of a plant which are joined at one end to the branch
CW - is a node on a tree with no child nodes.
 - „**branch**“ – RW – a part of something larger
CW - files and folders on a hard drive are organized into branches
 - *Domain, Frame, Null, Port, Push, Queue, Wireless...*

TECH ACRONYMS

- The most of words connected with computers are used as an Acronyms
 - They are used because:
 - Easier for communication between IT people
 - Space saving (*.gif = *. Graphics Interchange Format)
 - Time saving
 - ...

- „**GIF**“ - Graphics Interchange Format
 - „**GUI**“ – RW – a man (guy)
CW - Graphical User Interface
 - „**SOAP**“ – RW - used for washing the body
CW - Simple Object Access Protocol
 - „**NAT**“ – RW - dry fruit (nut)
CW - Network Address Translation
 - „**POP3**“ - Post Office Protocol
